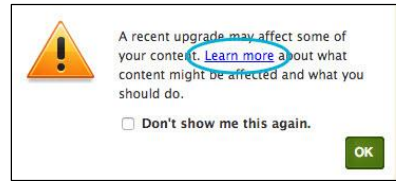

You're probably reading this because you clicked the *Learn more* link when you edited one of your apps. The editor on several of our apps has been updated in order to make your content more **adaptive**—better able to adjust to fit on most devices.



You'll see a message if the app you are editing contains certain content, namely HTML tags that were inserted when you used certain editor features.



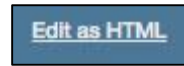
If the editor sees a tag it doesn't support, the message you got displays; if it supports your content, no message displays.

OK, so now here's what you can do to continue.

First, you might want to check *Don't show me this again* and click **OK**. This turns off the pop-up information message—it will never display again for this app.



- You can simply edit text—fix such things as spelling errors, punctuation or grammar.
- You can edit using HTML. Click the *Edit as HTML* link within the Notification Bar. It will always display when the editor sees a tag it doesn't support.



Use the Source Code window to edit content and click **Ok**. Unsupported content is removed.



- Consider using other ways to display your content in the future. For example, use the Embed Code App to display videos. Or, instead of using HTML code to build a table, use the Table App. Here you see the Table App used with other apps on the page.



The apps that have updated editors include the *Announcements, Assignments, Blog, and Calendar Apps*. Consider alternatives for other apps such as the *Article Library and Headlines & Features* as well.
